



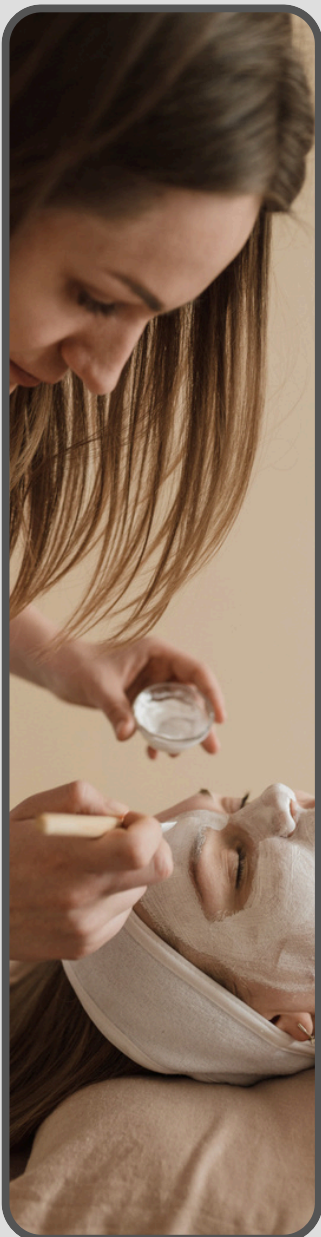


DG DERMA's M.SC. PROGRAMS

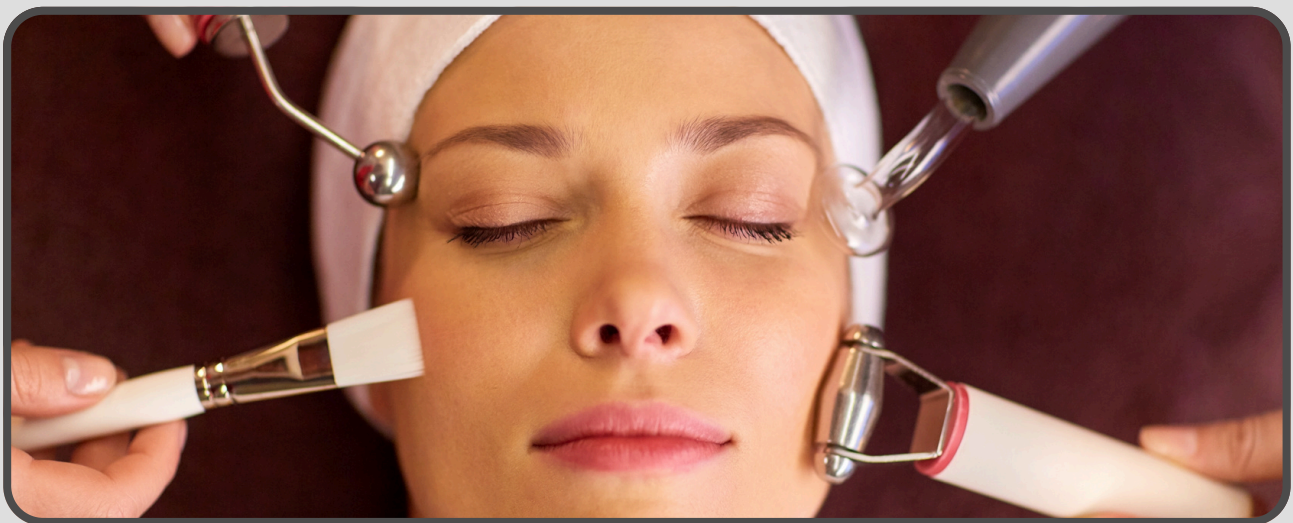
